Continuing along the themes brought forward by Dr. Hyndman on April 28th, this talk will review considerations for castrations in dogs (and cats). Complications of this routine procedure will be discussed. We will also review potential consequences of not proceeding with castration and review some of the hormone dependent diseases we see affecting male dogs in practice. Unfortunately, one size fits all types of answers are not available. The hope is that a review of the available information will help guide conversations between clients and their primary care veterinarians as to why a routine neuter is a good idea in most patients.
